- The Preliminary Site Assessment report indicated that the hazardous wastes previously disposed at the site do not represent a significant threat. However, the lagoon sediments in Lagoon 2 are above TAGM 4046 levels and require removal or solidification in place.

#### Site Description:

This former Majestic Weaving Corp. operation consisted of applying of colors to textiles by printing and dyeing techniques. The textiles were washed and finished after coloration. Approximately ten buildings are located on site. All are empty. A number of 55-gallon drums were on site with varying quantities of what appeared to be waste solvents, spent fuel and various chemicals, i.e. thermal liquid oil, acetone, heat transfer medium, etc. Some drums were bulging, others had rotted and were stored approximately ten yards from a creek. Two surface impoundments on site were at about 50% of capacity. There was evidence of the liner being cracked.

An Interim Remedial Measure (IRM) for removal of 90 drums has been completed. Analysis of the drummed material showed most of the drums to contain hazardous wastes: 1,1,1-trichloroethane and tetrachloroethene. Soil analysis showed one area of soils to be contaminated with tetrachloroethene at 215 ppm. The NYSDEC negotiated a consent order with the PRP which was signed on 7/25/95 for a Preliminary Site Assessment (PSA). The DEC reviewed and approved the workplan for the PSA and Fieldwork started in May 1996. The final PSA report was submitted to the Department in February 1998. The PSA Report indicated that the hazardous wastes previously disposed at the site do not represent a significant threat. However, the lagoon sediments from lagoons 2 are above TAGM 4046 and will be removed or solidified in place. Sediment residue found on the lower warehouse cement floor will be removed as hazardous waste.

### Assessment of Health Problems:

Sediments in the on-site lagoons were sampled and classified as industrial rather than hazardous waste. Removal of these sediments from the site by a licenced disposal facility is anticipated, which will eliminate the potential for contact. Contaminated soils were previously removed from the site. The on-site warehouse was pressure washed and sampled and no significant contamination remains. The population he vicinity of the site is served by public water which is tested routinely. Therefore, exposures to contaminated groundwater are not ted.
